The Chilterns MS Centre provides services and advice to people with multiple sclerosis (MS), their families and carers. We try to help people living with the disease by offering a number of life changing and supportive therapies and treatments that are effective for the patient, such as specialist neuro-physiotherapy. Oxygen treatment, hydrotherapy and reflexology. The treatments, therapies and support we provide have a genuine impact on the individual changing the quality of their daily life. The Chilterns MS Centre treats 260 patients each week and no one is ever turned away, however minor or severe their disability.

The Chilterns MS Centre moved to a new, purpose-built facility in 2012 which offers the potential for increased amounts of care for more people. We care for people who live within a roughly 30 miles radius of the centre, this also includes people from the Oxfordshire area who are in the Bucks PCT.

We rely on donations and fundraising for most of our income and receive a small amount of funding from NHS. Currently, the Centre is embarking on a range of fundraising initiatives to cover the costs of running the Centre.

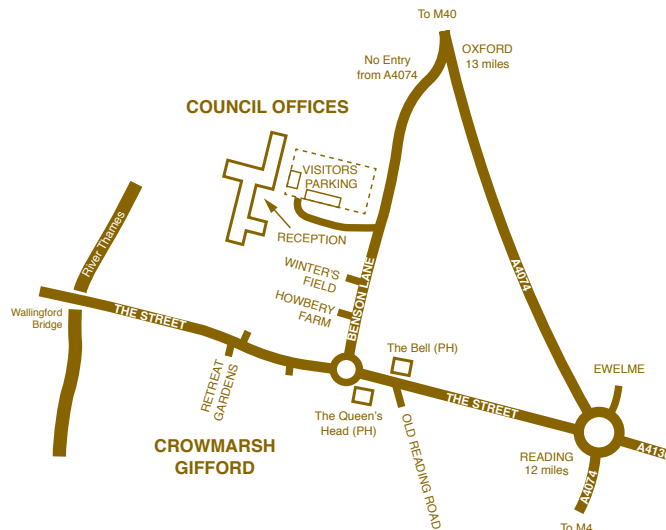

The Oxford Heart Centre manages patients with complex heart problems from around the region (population 2 million) and is an expert centre for cardiovascular disease. Imaging patients' hearts using ultrasound is a major part of their assessment, and echocardiography is now at the scientific and medical heart of the most advanced diagnosis. The new Echocardiography unit that is planned will allow us to increase the number of scans, collaborate in more research, diagnose more precisely the underlying condition of the heart and give us the ability to perform more complex assessments so central to the life-saving procedures carried out by cardiologists and surgeons.

Advanced 3D imaging is an essential first stage for some procedures such as insertion of heart valves through a keyhole technique (a new procedure that allows patients to avoid heart surgery). Due to a significant increase in the number of patients, and the complexity of their disease, the need for advanced echocardiography is pressing. It is estimated that one in four of the patient population will need an echo. The new facilities would sit neatly between hospital and university departments, thus fast tracking research benefits to patients, jump-starting innovative projects and training the very best young doctors to become the next generation of heart specialists and researchers.
